ed can be regarded as a non-visual but scriptable
version of **vi**

Why did I want to learn ed?

Had developed the script **build_man.sh** which is part of the build process for *libnetfilter_queue* which is a component of the Linux Netfilter project.

The script was taking far longer than all the rest of the build, owing to using the shell as an editor (commands head, tail, cp, cat &c.). Using ed would be faster. [Other speedups became possible but I'll only talk about them if encouraged]

What can ed do that sed can't?

- Reposition lines, especially to before where they used to be
- Perform multiple passes through the file

What can sed do that ed can't?

- Go in the middle of a pipe (ed can go at the front of a pipe)
- Limited conditional editing (not recommended) [I wanted to use **q** originally but project admin said no]
